Oregon DEQ Announces New Grant Funding Available for Medium- and Heavy-Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Charging Infrastructure and Technical Assistance

The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality is opening the application period for a new <u>Oregon Zero-Emission Fueling Infrastructure Grant</u> program. Individuals, businesses and public agencies are invited to apply for financial assistance from DEQ's one-time \$15 million program to support installation of new charging facilities for zero-emission medium- and heavy-duty trucks, buses and equipment.

The OZEF Capital Improvement Grants Application pertains to projects that are ready to implement eligible capital improvements on site. Projects that are currently in need of technical assistance funding should respond to the OZEF Technical Assistance Grant Application.
